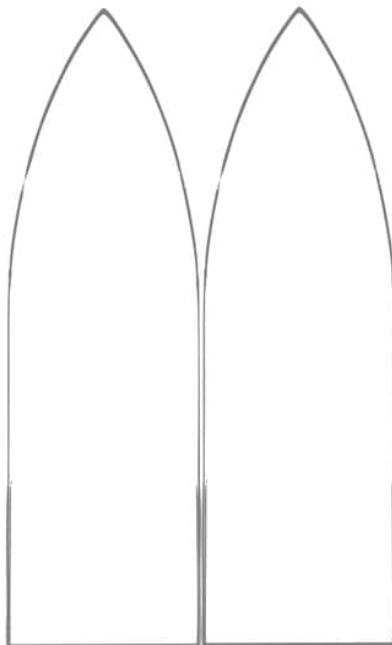

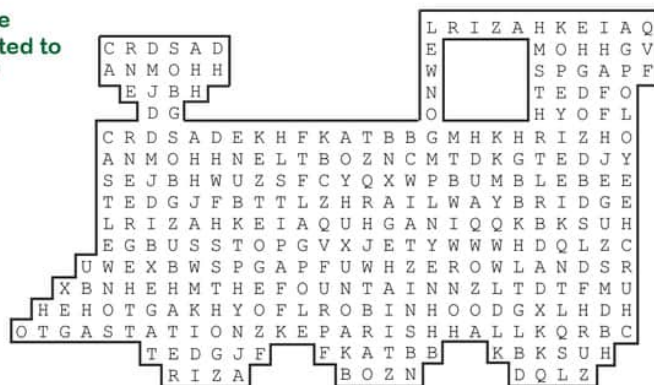
Churches often have beautiful stained glass windows, telling stories from the Bible. Can you design a colourful window for the Church on the Green?

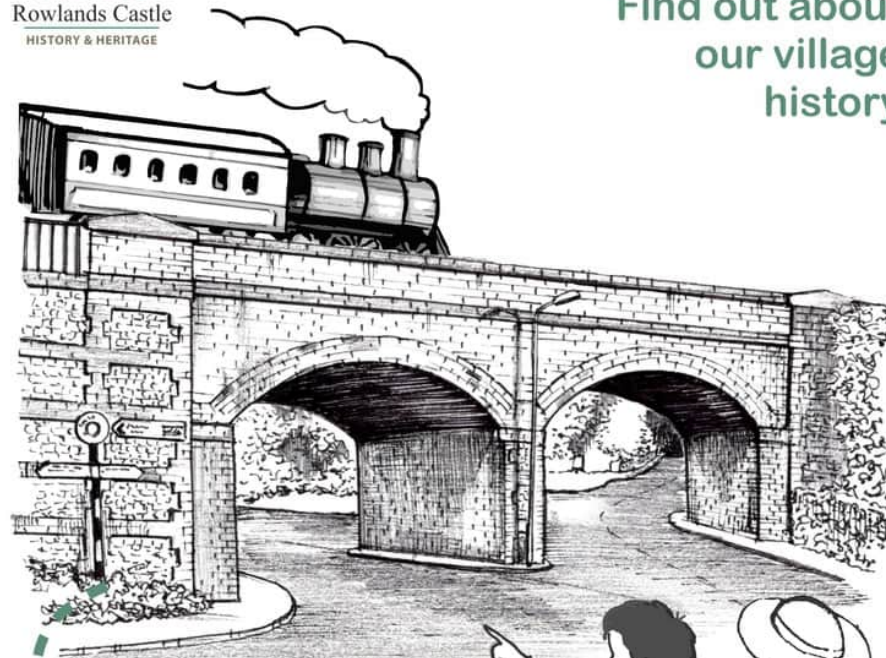

8. The Bumblebee café was built in 1816 as a grocery store and bakery. It has been a butcher's shop, a Post Office and even a car sales room!

1. Millions of years ago this area was under the sea. Shepherds used to find fossils of these sea urchins and so they became known as Shepherd's Crowns.

7. The Fountain is one of the oldest buildings in Rowlands Castle. John Smith built a cottage and brew house here in 1740 and it has been a pub since 1833.

6. This row of white cottages used to sell teas and flowers to visitors from Portsmouth, who came for a day trip on the newly opened railway line.

4. The flag is raised in the centre of the Green to remember important events in history. If the flag is flying, look at the sign on the flagpole to find out what the occasion is.

5. The Church on the Green was built in 1881. The white cottage round the corner, which is now a hairdressers, used to be the Church but was replaced when it became too small for the number of worshippers.

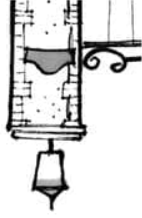
3. The village loves to celebrate the Royal Family. This mosaic was built to celebrate Queen Elizabeth's Diamond Jubilee. Can you find any more Royal commemorations along this road?

2. Behind this flint wall are the ruins of the castle that gives the village its name. It was a Motte and Bailey castle built when the Normans invaded Britain in 1066.
